

For Lavender Lovers Who Wish To Take Flowers Back Home

Would you like to bring back your sweet memories of lavender with you? Here are the tips in order to avoid unnecessary troubles at the quarantine station. Please note that importing foreign plants into different country can be very complicated matter, and you need to follow the country's plant protection laws. There are 3 maximum steps that you may be applied. Please look carefully how many steps you will need to take them home.

- (A) Step One: Apply the import permission from your country prior to your departure.
 (B) Step Two: Take an exam to earn "phytosanitary certificate" from Japan quarantine station.
 (C) Step Three: Take an exam at your country's quarantine station at arrival.
